Status of the clinics in Canada

Research

Haemostatic changes during and after pregnancy in healthy women and in women with inherited bleeding disorders.

Normal women:

Recruitment is finished.

Inherited bleeding disorders

Planned sample size: 25 women

Recruitment up to March 2009: 19 women

3 centres are open: Quebec, Kingston and Ste-Justine

Half of the women were recruited in the last year.

Our objective is to finish the study within a year.

The study is open to other centers.

There is funding from CHS/Wyeth "Care until cure program"
